

MWR tents provide a place to relax
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There are places to get out of the monotony of exercise life and get some rest and relaxation regardless of day and night. Morale, Welfare and Recreation tents provide exercise participants with these opportunities.

“The main purpose of pitching the MWR tents is to increase the morale and fighting spirit of soldiers who participate in RSO&I 2001 in Command Post Oscar,” said Pfc. Kim, Ui-jin of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Eighth U.S. Army Arms Room. Kim works at the MWR tent setup in front of the Butler 4.

MWR tents are places for soldiers to keep back and relax. They supply services available like a television and food. Movies are showing continuously and many kinds of snack such as hotdog, chips, crackers, popcorn, candy, soda, and burritos are sold there. Exercise participants can watch a movie, read a newspaper or just sit back and enjoy a hot cup of coffee.

There are total 3 tents on Camp Walker. One is located in next to Supply Room near the Butler building 1, another is beside the Butler building 4, and the third is close to the main gate of the Camp. A tent is also available at Camp Henry near the Life Support Area.

These MWR tents are open 24 hours. If you need to take a rest after your twelve-hour shift, they are the place to be.
